

Korea's Developmental State: Some context-specific supportive characteristics

(overdetermined; not 'necessary'; e.g. Ethiopia)

ECONOMIC

- Labour-intensive vs natural resource intensive
- 'Stage' of development: investment-driven growth
- Low inequality

SOCIAL, POLITICAL, CULTURAL

- Homogenous society
- Developmental leadership
- Bureaucracy: 500+ years of meritocratic recruitment & promotion
- Confucian: hierarchy & reciprocity

The limits of institutional engineering

Bureaucracy is governed by politics

– Mushtaq Khan: "Is distribution of benefits supported by institutions consistent with distribution of power?"

Historical legacies:

- Colonial (Acemoglu & Robinson)
- "Give war a chance?" (Tilly; Fukuyama)

Economic development:

Emergence of 'majority' middle class

Messy democracies: From top-down public sector to multiple principals/stakeholders



Islands of effectiveness I:A Spectrum of Reform Options

- Incremental approaches which work around obstacles are at one end of the spectrum
- Multistakeholder approaches which aim to expand reform space are at the other end

Adapt design to align with existing reform space

Expand reform space via multistakeholder initiatives
