SURFACE LEASE AGREEMENTS



- Contract between landowner and right holder
- Governed by the law of contract ie voluntary agreement between parties
- Not a prerequisite of the legal framework
- Does contract provide/allow for alternative land uses?
- Implications for right holder? le, further rights/duties created by contract?





DEFINITION OF 'COMMUNITY'




- Consultation should be key requirement in terms of decision-making around postmine land use
- BUT: Consult with whom?
 - Traditional communities?
 - Mine communities?
 - Labour-sending areas?
- Conflicting/differing definitions in law
 - Historically disadvantaged persons
 - Interests/rights in area of land
 - Members exercise communal rights in terms of agreement, custom or law





ZONING REQUIREMENTS




- What are the implications for zoning of land?


JEMA

'the surroundings within which humans exist and that are made up of -

- (i) the land, water and atmosphere of the earth;
- (ii) micro-organisms, plant and animal life;
- (iii) any part or combination of (i) and (ii) and the interrelationships among and between them; and
- (iv) the physical, chemical, aesthetic and cultural properties and conditions of the foregoing the influence human health and wellbeing.'







 - Is the chosen instrument effective?
 - Cost? (Financial & Social)
 - DEMOCRATICALLY / POLITICALLY LEGITIMATE?



 ARE
