Our beautiful campus, nestled on the slopes of the majestic Table Mountain, is open and accessible—a feature that enriches our community in many ways. However, being an open campus also means we face some of the same challenges and risks experienced by the broader community. To ensure the safety and well-being of everyone, it is essential that we work together to foster a secure and welcoming environment. This guide is designed to help us reflect on practical steps we can take collectively to promote safety and inclusivity on campus.

Campus Protection Services

There are 80 Campus Protection officers on duty and ready to help you all hours of the day across campuses. CPS Officers operate on foot and in marked vehicles. They are trained to deal with the practical and legal aspects of any situation that may arise.

CPS monitors numerous CCTV cameras on campus from six permanent security centres at strategic points.

CPS officers provide security escorts on campus during the evenings upon request. Approach a CPS officer at any time.

We care about your safety!

Let's work together to create a safe and welcoming campus.

By following a few simple safety tips, you can make a difference. Have you:

- Familiarised yourself with the university safety and emergency guidelines?
- Saved the official emergency contact information 080 650 2222?
- Told someone that you will be on campus after hours?
- Closed access doors behind you?
- Not shared your access card with anyone else? (Sharing your access card compromises everyone's safety).
- Locked doors and windows if you are the last to leave a room/office?
- Kept your valuables out of sight? Most thefts are opportunistic.
- Checked that your vehicle is locked?
- Ensured you are aware of your surroundings when walking? (Wearing headphones or being on your phone can distract you).

Report broken doors, windows, or locks on the Properties and Services (P&S) Workplace Services Portal: https://services.ps.uct.ac.za/ or to a staff member who manages maintenance-related issues.



Step 1 Raise the alarm by telling others in your area, activate the nearest Red Break Glass panel, and call CPS.

Step 2 Follow the building evacuation procedure.

Step 3 Contain the fire if you can do so without endangering yourself. If not, wait for a CPS officer to arrive.



Step 1 Call CPS.

Step 2 If you don't have first aid training, wait for a CPS officer or get assistance from the nearest first aider to arrive.

Step 3 Report the incident to the area health and safety representative.



Step 1 Stay calm and keep your distance: do not approach or attempt to handle the snake. Most snakes will move away if not threatened.

Step 2 Report the sighting immediately. Contact CPS on their 24-hour toll-free number, 080 650 2222. Provide the exact location and description of the snake, if possible.

Step 3 In case of a bite: Stay calm, limit movement, and call for immediate medical assistance by contacting CPS on their 24-hour toll-free number, 080 650 2222.
