


Dr Marianne Camerer

Bonsoir à tous. My name is Marianne Camerer and I direct the Building Bridges programme at the University of Cape Town's Nelson Mandela School of Public Governance. The School is guided by the legacy of Nelson Mandela who fought for the values of Non-racialism, Non-Sexism, Equality, Social Justice, and Human Dignity.
